The successful candidate should have the capacity to build trust and maintain the confidence of the Board of Education, staff, parents, community members and students.

The next superintendent must have demonstrated that he/she has the ability to motivate students and staff to higher levels of success. He/she must be a good steward of financial resources while ensuring that the needs of all students are being met. He/she must truly care about all those with whom he/she interacts in his/her capacity as the educational leader of the Franklinville Central School District.

The Board of Education has identified the following characteristics (in priority order) as required of the next superintendent:

- **Person of unquestioned integrity**
- **Strong commitment to improving student achievement/student success**
- **Strong presence in the schools and community**
- **Ability to clearly identify problems and develop effective solutions**
- **Strong background in instruction and student achievement**
- **Outstanding written and oral communication skills**
- **Delegates responsibilities but holds subordinates accountable**
- **Knowledgeable with regard to collective bargaining and labor relations practices**
- **Reflective thinker-not impulsive**
- **Committed to involving others in decision-making**

THE FRANKLINVILLE CENTRAL SCHOOL DISTRICT

The district houses a total of 713 students distributed over two school buildings. The elementary school building has an enrollment of 404 students in Pre-k-6th grade; while 309 students attend grades 7-12 in the high school known as Ten Broeck Academy. The student population is stabilizing.

The high school offers five college level courses through Syracuse University, including forensics, calculus, Spanish, English and U.S. history. An in-district Agriculture program is available for students that will earn them Career Technical Education credit on campus. Students also take advantage of BOCES programming for Career Technical Education opportunities including New Visions Health Science.

Over the past three years in the middle and high school, there have been many advances in the STEM program. A STEAM lab and Maker Space have also been added. Coding I, II, and 8th grade Lego Robotics and Introduction to Engineering are recent courses added to the curriculum.

At the elementary level the staff has developed and implemented a Rtl process for reading. They have established benchmark assessments and have a clear understanding of where students are in the development of reading. They are also in the process of developing a writing curriculum.

ANNOUNCEMENT OF VACANCY

The Franklinville Board of Education is seeking a highly qualified leader to fill the position of Superintendent of Schools. The search process will be completed over the next few months with the successful candidate beginning employment in August of 2018.

The vacancy is due to the retirement of Michelle Spasiano who has led the district for the past nine years. Dr. Vincent J. Coppola, Search Consultant, representing the Western New York Educational Service Council, is assisting the Board of Education with the search process.

The consultant will carry out the task of screening applicants and recommending to the Board a group of potential semi-finalists. Candidates must not contact board members directly. The Franklinville Board of Education will make all decisions regarding the selection of candidates to be interviewed, the evaluation of candidates and the final appointment.

The first round of interviews, with the Board only, are scheduled for June 1 and 2, 2018.

The second round of interviews with those selected from the first round of interviews will be held on June 11, 2018. During the second round, the candidates will meet with the Board for another interview. The candidates will also make 2 presentations, one to the community and one to the staff.
